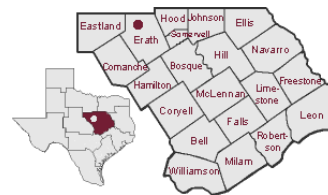

4-H Contest Info

Judges and Superintendents need to be in the Tarleton University at 8:30 a.m. for a brief orientation. If the original judges cannot represent your county, agents are responsible for substitutes.

Contestants go directly to the contest location, where they register and are ready to begin the contests at 9:30 a.m.

A table will be available in each educational presentation contest room and the contest superintendent is requested to bring a standing easel.

Contestants are responsible for all other needed materials and equipment.

Contest room doors open briefly between presentations. If seating is available after contestants are seated, others are encouraged to watch the contests, but should avoid entering the contest room during a presentation.

Share-the-Fun Contests



The Share the Fun Contest (Vocal, Poetry/Prose, Choreographed Routines, Music-Instrumental, Solo/Band, and Celebrate 4-H categories). Each county may have two entries in each category and age group. The senior district winners (first and second place) in each of the five categories qualifies for State 4-H Roundup.

4-Hers may not enter the same category in which they have previously been part of a first place entry at State; however, they may choose other categories to include: Poetry/Prose, Choreographed Routines, Vocal, Music/Band, and Celebrate 4-H. See Contest Resource for Rules and Guidelines:

Dressing areas will be available near the contest rooms. We do not need everyone dressing at one time.

At 9:20 a.m. the first act will set up on stage, 9:30 a.m. they perform and the second group will be back stage.

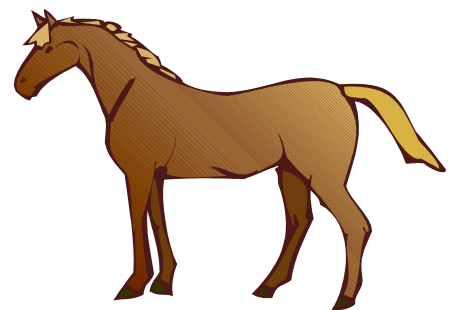
