



Williamson County 4-H Senior Awards



All 4-H members age 14-19 (as of August 31 of the current 4-H year) are eligible to receive the following awards. Requirements must be completed during the current 4-H year.

Rookie Award

- * Attend at least 50% of club meetings held since you joined 4-H.
- * Complete one project.
- * Give a demonstration, talk or exhibit on project (*goats, food, computers, horticulture, etc.*)
- * Participate in one community service project.
- * Give a written or oral report to a 4-H leader on the project (council, camp, stock show prospect show, etc.).

Letterman Award

- * Attend $\frac{2}{3}$ of regular club meetings.
- * Complete three or more projects.
- * Participate in two or more community service projects.
- * Serve as a 4-H Teen Leader by organizing or conducting a 4-H club/county/city event.
- * Serve as an elected officer or on a committee.
- * Promote 4-H to other groups.
- * Provide training or presentation to a 4-H project group organized and conducted by someone else.
- * Participate in a county, district, or state Leadership training.
- * Assist in a community service project.
- * Provide an educational program at a club or council meeting.
- * Extend the 4-H program by teaching or leading a project or even for other youth.
- * Represent Williamson County 4-H at a district, state, or national 4-H competitive event.
- * Serve in a leadership position in a group other than 4-H.
- * Research career opportunities.
- * Turn in a complete Recordbook.

Gold Star

- * Must be at least 15 years of age as of August 31, 2014.
- * Must have been in 4-H for at least 3 years, including the current year.
- * The Gold Star Award will be presented to the most deserving young person without regard to gender.
- * The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Record Book in the year he or she is to be

considered for the Gold Star Award.

- * The 4-H member must have completed three different project areas during their 4-H career.
- * Must have participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas: Educational Presentation, Contests, Project Exhibits, Camps, Leadership Lab, Citizenship Activities, Public Relations, etc.
- * Must have exhibited leadership skills in on or more of the following areas: Served as a 4-H club officer or committee chairman, served as a junior or teen leader in and activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult volunteer leader.
- * Must have participated in one or more community service activity.

Danforth "I Dare You" Award

- * Must be at least 15 years of age as of August 31, 2014.
- * Must have been in 4-H for at least 3 years, including the current year.
- * The Gold Star Award will be presented to the most deserving young person without regard to gender.
- * The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Record Book in the year he or she is to be considered for the Gold Star Award.
- * The 4-H member must have completed three different project areas during their 4-H career.
- * Must have participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas: Educational Presentation, Contests, Project Exhibits, Camps, Leadership Lab, Citizenship Activities, Public Relations, etc.
- * Must have exhibited leadership skills in on or more of the following areas: Served as a 4-H club officer or committee chairman, served as a junior or teen leader in and activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult volunteer leader.
- * Must have participated in one or more community service activity.
- * May not receive this award more than once from any organization.
