4-H is full of opportunities and experiences, and I hope that you find our program to be an exciting and continuous journey for youth development!

4-H is a youth development program offered through the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, part of the Texas A&M University System in partnership with your local county government. Youth in grades 3–12 can join 4-H, and those in K–2 can participate through Clover Kids.

How to Get Started:

1. Explore Your Interests: 4-H offers hands-on learning through projects—topics that members want to learn more about. Browse all available Texas 4-H projects on the [Texas 4-H Project Page](#).
2. Find a Club: Clubs are the heart of 4-H and are run by volunteer Club Managers and Project Leaders. Some are community clubs that offer a range of projects, while others are project-specific clubs. Our unique clubs are located throughout the county and offer different projects. You're welcome to visit several clubs before choosing, and you can even join more than one!
3. Contact Club Leaders: Once you've found a club that matches your interests, reach out to the Club Manager to attend a meeting. Clubs participate in service projects, leadership activities, and fun learning experiences.
4. Enroll Online: Register through [TX4-H](#) to officially become a member. The 4-H year starts each September. After enrolling, you'll receive updates from the Extension Office, your club, and our county newsletter, Williamson County 4-H Happenings.

For Adults:

Volunteers are a vital part of 4-H! Adults can enroll through the same system to support clubs, lead projects, and help at events. All volunteers complete safety training and a background check.
